Dear Blencathra Parents

Here is a summary of the Curriculum for Blencathra for the Autumn Term 2022.

Our topic this term is Changes in Britain from Stone Age to Iron Age



ITERACY - This term we will be using the book How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth' where the children will develop the skills needed to write instructions. We will also be linking to our Stone Age topic by looking at the features of non-chronological reports where we will spend time gathering and researching information before creating a non-chronological report on a Stone Age animal or Otiz 'The Ice Man' A focus will also be on our spellings, punctuation, grammar and handwriting.

Everyone will have a guided reading sessions once a week with Mrs Turner, where the children develop their reading skills and also their decoding skills.

RE - Using the Understanding Christianity resource we will be discussing the question: What do Christian's learn from the creation story? The children will learn that God the Creator cares for the creation, including human beings. They will know that as human beings are part of God's good creation, they do best when they listen to God. We will also learn how Christians believe God made our wonderful world and so we should look after it.

MUSIC - Continuing with the Charanga scheme we are focussing on basic skills: listening and appraising, singing, playing instruments, improvisation, composition and performing. We are also very lucky to have Mr Burke teaching us some music this term, where we will be using recorders, whistles, keyboards and percussion. We also have the Young Voices songs to learn this term

ART/D&T - We will really be looking at how we can use our sketchbooks to record our observations and also to review and revisit our ideas, we will see them as working documents, not just as finished pieces of work. We will be linking our artwork to our Stone Age topic and we will be improving our drawing, painting and sculpture techniques using a range of materials.

Next we will start to look at addition and subtraction, using written methods. Multiplication and division are next, also using written methods, and explaining their reasoning.

The children will also be learning about shapes and angles.

We are also having a big push on times tables so will be assessing the children daily on their times tables using the Times Tables Rock Stars. It is important that the children practise these regularly at home.

PE - The children will be taking part in a series of street dance sessions this term with Kelly McClelland. We will work towards a final performance where parents can come and be our audience.

We will also be having a skateboarding session, and will be taking part in a ball sports festival run by Action Ants.

For the second half of the term, we will have Miss Potter—a specialist sports coach—to help us with various skills and sports through playing games.

PSHE - This term, we will be learning more about our school vision and values. We will think about new beginnings, and how we can be affected by them. We will learn more about healthy eating and food using the Phunky Foods resources, then we will move on to physical health and first aid.

Computing - We will be learning all about programming.

We will be looking at the motion, sound and event

blocks using Scratch.

In the second half of the term, we will be looking at using Stop Motion animation to create our own animations on the water cycle.
