Project Ideas			
Create a tourist brochure for a holiday destination in Egypt. (Geography and Literacy)	Create a fact file, information booklet or Power Point about a Pharaoh. (History)	Reasearch Ancient Egypt hieroglyphic alphabet and then write a message, fact or joke for the class to read. (Art and English)	The Ancient Egyptians had their own number system. Research this and then make a poster to tell others how their number system worked. You might want to write your own calculations using their number system. (Maths)
Create an acrostic poem using one of the following related words: Ancient Egypt, Cleopatra, Tutankhamun, or any other topic related word. Your poem needs to relate to your topic word and you need to publish and illustrate it. (English)	Sew, print or design something from Ancient Egyptian times, for example: clothing, jewellery, headdress. Etc. (Art/Design and Technology)	Create a collage of pictures or photos from Egypt to show where you have visited or where you would like to visit in Egypt. (Computing, Geography)	Build your own junk model of an aspect of Ancient Egypt, for example: Pyramids, tombs, mummies, reed boat etc. (Art/Design and Technology)
The Ancient Egyptians used shadufs to lift water from the canals. Could you research what a shaduf is and how it works and then make your own? (Design and Technology and Science)	Make a 3D model of the head for one of the Egyptian Gods or Goddesses. You might want to use paper mache to do this. (Art and Design and Technology)	The hour-watcher priest was in charge of making sure the temple rituals were carried out on time. By day, he used the sun and by night, he used a water clock. Research a water clock and have a go and making one. (Computing and Maths)	Canopic jars were used in Ancient Egyptian times. Research what they were used for and what they looked like and then have a go at making one. (Art and History)
