




Blencathra Homework Project Ideas

Project Ideas

Research a favorite Author and then produce a factsheet or booklet to tell others about them.	Visit and join Shap or Penrith library. While you are there look at the large selection of books and choose one or two that you would like to read. Once you have read them, create a book review that we can put up in our reading area.	Create your own fictional character. Draw what your character will look like and write a character description. Remember to use ambitious vocabulary to describe what they look like and their personality is like.	Listen to an audiobook. While you are listening, draw the characters from the descriptions you hear. 
Look at lots of book front covers. Then design and create your own front cover, this could be by hand or on the computer. 	Made a 3D model of your favourite fictional character.	Ask your parents what their favourite book was when they were a child. Then either ask them to read it to you or you could read it. Write a book review for it.	Ask an adult to read a story or part of a story to you once or twice a week. Talk about the story together.
Use your art skills to paint or draw a scene from a book you enjoy.	Retell a book you have read using puppets, teddies or your family. You could video it for us all to watch.	Make a 3D scene in a shoebox from a book you have enjoyed. 	Read a book and then watch the film adaptation. Record the similarities and differences.

Please choose 2 projects to complete from above.
You should hand in your project on or before Monday 1st November and Monday 13th December.

You can hand your project in by returning it to school or by uploading photos, documents or videos to the homework assignment on Teams.

Children will then have time to share their homework in the class on or during the week commencing the hand in date. These projects give you a number of weeks to complete each project so please make sure you put a lot of effort and thought into your homework. You need to think about how you are going to present your work and make sure you do this to a high standard.

We do not want children completing these the night before they need to be handed in.
