Things to Remember:

Topic: Beside the Seaside ↓ The Kings Coronation

All Reception and Nursery Lessons are taught through the 7 Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Areas of Learning and Development: Prime areas: Communication and Language, (CL) Personal, Social and Emotional Development (PSED) and Physical Development (PD). The 4 other specific areas are Literacy (L), Mathematics (M), Understanding the World (UW) and Expressive Arts and Design (EAD) **PSED:** The children will explore friendships and relationships with others as well as thinking of reasons how to make our lives harmonious. They will listen to stories related to these issues and discuss ways to adapt them to everyday life.

Compare families and relationships to The Royal Family and the significance of The Kings Coronation for us.

Friday PSHE Cycle: The whole class will be learning about Health and First Aid.

Maths: Older Nursery: Number recognition, 2D shape, repeated patterns, CapaCity & vocabulary related to position Reception: White Rose Maths inspired Learning through the theme 'To 20 and Beyond. Matching, sorting, ordering, subtracting, adding using numbers to 20 Measure CapaCity and revisit 3D and 2D

RE: Theme: What Can We Learn From Stories?

Read and talk about lessons learned from Stories from different cultures: The Boy Who Cried Wolf, Best Friends (an Asian story) and The Lost Coin

Think about The Royal Family and their link to Christianity and The Church of England.

Enhancements:

Pet lambs visit school Visit to Maryport Aquarium and Allonby Beach Action Ants First Aid Wheel Chair Basket Ball taster Possible trip to the stream for a boat race **CL:** The areas set up around the classroom will encourage a language rich environment. Opportunities will be given to develop teacher lead learning and real life experiences eg a beach / aquarium role play will help the children re-enact experiences they have had on seaside holidays and with sea life and realise what to expect on our visit to Maryport. A castle / palace role play and dressing up will help signify the Kings Coronation. An ice cream shop will allow them to explore vocabulary and tranasctions related to buying and selling

All the continuous provision areas in the classroom aim to reflect and encourage speech. The adults in the classroom work in all the areas to question the children to introduce new Vocabulary inspire learning, developed from the children's own interests.



UW: Children share experiences of seaside visits in this Country and abroad and talk about Coastal features and the differences to where we live. Learn about seaside holidays in the past and how things have changed.

Discuss water safety and be made aware of global issues such as plastic pollution and how we can help.

Grow and plant seeds and shrubs and know how to Care and look after plants.

Note the season Changes, new life including animals and their young

Talk about the Kings Coronation and reenact this Special day in our country's history.

PD: The children are able to access fine and gross motor activities set out in the indoor and outdoor provision.
