This information will give you an idea of what we plan to cover during this half term, however it may alter with the needs and interests of the children. Reception children will be taught directly linked to the content within; If appropriate, Nursery children will access this direct 'teaching', alternatively, they will access the continuous provision set out in the areas around the classroom linked to the content below. Week 1/2: Magical Me \& My Fantastic Family: Establish a class charter based around the story of 'Bumble Bear', discovering ways to help Catbells Class 'Bee Amazing!' Talk about families and who lives in our home. Think about hobbies and interests and places we like to visit with our family. Read the story of Goldilocks and the 3 Bears and relate to items in the class home corner ie the big bowl belonging to Daddy bear. Read The Gingerbread Man and identify body parts. Make Gingerbread Men. Count and match buttons. Think about Autumn changes and make tree / leaf pictures for the church boards. Develop mark making techniques and writing names. Complete Reception Baseline, phonics and maths assessments.
Week 2: Magical Shoes: Read stories including: The Elves \& the Shoe maker, Puss in Boots, Simon Sock, The Smartest Giant in Town \& The bear \& the Magic Shoes. Match shoes and socks in to pairs. Look at shapes \& patterns, length and sizes. Explore types od shoes suitable for different purposes. Sing rhymes: Cobbler, cobbler. We're marching in our Wellingtons, There was an Old Woman who lived in a Shoe. Paint \& decorate stockings in preparation for publishing cauliflour cards for Christmas.
Week 3: Harmonious Harvest: Read stories including The Enormous Turnip \& The Little Red Hen. Think about harvest and it's significance to the church and our community. Walk around the village looking for signs of Autumn and changes happening in nature. Sort and count natural objects and make Magical mixtures in outdoor education sessions. Sing songs: Hickety Pickety my Red Hen, 5 Little Apples, Oats \& Beans \& Barley grow and prepare a song to perform for the harvest festival service. Draw and paint self portraits.

## Harvest Festival: Friday $30^{\text {th }}$ September

Week 4: Wolf Stories: Read, Little Red Riding Hood, The Three Little Pigs \& The 3 Little Wolves \& the big Bad Pig Talk about stranger danger and road safety. Think about materials and which float and sink and if they are waterproof and think about how we can test them. Make magic wands and houses using natural materials in Outdoor Education sessions. Draw or paint fairy tale characters for a castle display.
Week 5: Tremendous Towers: Read similar to Jack and the Beanstalk \& Rapunzel Discover how shoots can grow from a bean. Look at and taste different types of bean: baked, runner, broad, kidney, coffee, jelly Develop repeating patterns and capacity discovering how much can fit inside. Continue to develop pencil and scissor control for name writing.

Weeks 6: Perfect Princesses \& Naughty Witches Read stories including Sleeping Beauty, The Princess \& the Pea Think of words to describe various fairy tale characters. Hot seat and guess which characters the children are thinking of. Continue to develop repeating patterns by developing printing techniques and making fruit kebabs. Make a class flag for worship time. Sing songs including 'There was a Princess Long Ago' \& 'When you want to make a spell"
