# Using Sway for Teaching and Learning: Creating a Sway

## **Step 1:** Log into Office.com and Select the Sway App

Sway is a web-based app that's ideal for sharing a wide range of content, e.g. class communications and learning materials. They are easy to create and viewable on phones and tablets upwards. Log into your Office 365 account and click on the **Sway** icon to start.





Choose to create a **New Blank Sway** from the options block. NB: If you already have content, you can convert it by choosing **Start from a Document** 

## Step 2: Start putting your content into Sway

Storyline Design

Start your Sway in **Storyline** mode from the options in the top left corner.

Content is placed into Sway using 'cards'. These help you to break up and structure your content clearly. The card below is your Title Card, and you can add a title and background image

Images can be added from your own resources or using a Creative Commons filtered image search, so images can be placed directly into the Sway.


Add new cards to your Sway by clicking the + sign. You can add new sections that include text and headings to separate out and order learning materials appropriately, e.g., dividing up content into lessons.

## Step 3: Add other media content



Content can be added from a wide range of media types, including videos selected from streaming services, your own channels, or media files you have uploaded directly.

In the example below, the teacher has selected Add > Video and searched for videos about Henry VIII. Once the required video has appeared, it can be selected by clicking on the video thumbnail. The teacher then clicks the green Add button (top-right) to add the video into the Sway card. They can then add a caption to the video. This caption could explain what the student should be doing whilst watching the video, e.g. answering questions or taking notes.



Use the formatting tools in the Card toolbar to control how your text looks and feels, e.g. with bold or italicised text. You can also add in hyperlinks to websites and other documents too using the Link button. The icons indicating small, medium and large elements help you toggle the size of each element in the final document.

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## **Step 4:** Preview your Sway with the Play Icon



To preview your Sway, click on Play to see what your content currently looks like on the screen.

Henry VIII (28 June 1491 - 28 January 1547) was King of England from 1509 until his death in 1547. Henry is best known for his six marriages, and, in particular, his efforts to have his first marriage (to Catherine of Aragon) annulled. His disagreement with Pope Clement VII on the question of such an annulment led Henry to initiate the English Reformation, separating the Church of England from papal authority. He appointed himself Supreme Head of the Church of England and dissolved convents and monasteries, for which he was excommunicated. Henry is also known as "the father of the Royal Navy," as he invested heavily in the navy, increasing its size from a few to more than 50 ships. and established the Navy Board

## **Step 5:** Adjust the Style and Flow of your Sway

Storyline

Once your content is ready, switch to **Design** mode to begin adjusting the overall design of your Sway.



Click on the Styles button to bring up a range of options and themes that can be applied to your Sway.





Design

Within the Styles options, you can choose whether your responsive content (i.e. how layout flows to different screens and devices) scrolls horizontally or vertically, or moves like a slideshow. You can also choose from a wide range of colour themes and styles to suit your content.

## **Step 6:** Share your Sway



Once your Sway is ready, you can share it with your classes or to your learning platform by clicking the Share button.

The Share menu presents options to control the access to the Sway content. If you are putting the content into a platform like Teams, for instance, choosing Anyone with a Link will suffice, but remember to ensure the Sway is set to view only. Copy the link to use in your lessons.
