Concepts / Themes / Big Questions

We use the *Salut* scheme of work and interactive whiteboard teaching resources to support our teaching and learning. The scheme enables our children to meet the end of Key Stage Attainment targets outlined in the National Curriculum and progressively develops key skills in French as children move up through the school!

French is introduced in EYFS and KS1 through the use of simple vocabulary in the classroom, using French greetings to answer the register and collective simple counting and using vocabulary linked to colours and days of the week.

In KS2 children are encouraged and supported to develop their speaking and listening skills through a range of interactive activities such as conversational work, role play, singing, games and stories. As confidence grows, children record work through pictures, phrases and sentences

Assessment / Proof of Progress

Each Unit of Work has a Progress Checklist which helps to check children's progress and map out next steps in teaching and learning. It features clearnly laid out statements and outcomes with different levels of attainment.

Teachers can use this as formative assessment to plan future learning and summative assessment for transition.

Enrichment: People, Locality and County

Whenever available, we invite native French speakers into school to complement our curriculum.

We are aiming to enrich our After School Clubs with a 'French Club'!

The Units of work have been distributed to the four classes and organised so as to complement the learning in other subjects when appropriate.

The units covered in EYFS and KS1 are included so as to complement the wider learning in the classroom environment and within continuous provision.

Monitoring Procedures

Subject Leader observes teaching via Learning Walks, sampling the lessons across KS2 to look for continuity and coherence. Pupil Voice gains children's perspective on their learning.
