## Changes in Britain from Stone Age to Iron Age



Create an information booklet on how to survive the Stone Age. Use information from your own research as well as the outdoor learning opportunities in school.



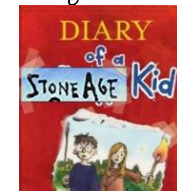
Write a story about a woolly mammoth. Remember to plan your story beginning, build up, problem, resolution and ending.



Create a fact sheet about a Woolly Mammoth or another animal that existed during the Stone Age



Write a diary entry from the point of view of someone living in the Stone Age.



Research Stonehenge and theories about the reasons why it was built. Create a display of your information and write an account of the theories.



Create a poem, rap or song about life in prehistoric times. Maybe use your recent rap as inspiration? Or, search for the BBC 'Horrible Histories' Stone Age song for inspiration.



Research and visit a local prehistoric monument e.g. Mayburgh Henge, Long Meg or Castlerigg Stone Circle. Present information about the site and your visit in any way you choose.



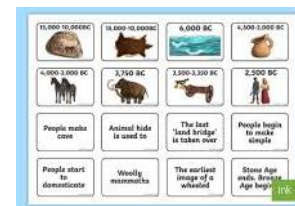
Can you find out what an archaeologist is and what they do? What skills do they need? Where would you go if you were an archaeologist? Why? Present your findings in a creative way for example on an information poster or board.



Research how homes changed for people from the Stone Age to the Iron Age. Make a model of a home from the time, and provide some information to display alongside.



Create a quiz or game which tests the knowledge of your class mates on our topic.



Please choose **at least one** project from the above, or **discuss your own idea with us**.  
You should hand the project in by **Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2024**. You can do this by returning it to school  
or by uploading it to Teams.

Children will have time to share their project with the class during the week after the hand in date.

This project is to be completed over several weeks during Autumn term, so we do expect a piece of work that is completed to a **high standard**. It is important that you plan this as a family and choose a project that will allow you to enjoy the process.
